Thence S 30°26'W 70 feet thence S 11°26'W 700 feet to the bank of old river. Thence S 11°26'W 200 feet across old river to the Anquia Cimarron.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD all the right, title, interest, estate and claim in and to the said premises, together with all and singular, the rights, privileges and appurtenances to the same in any manner belonging, unto the said ~~United States of America, its successors and assigns~~.
