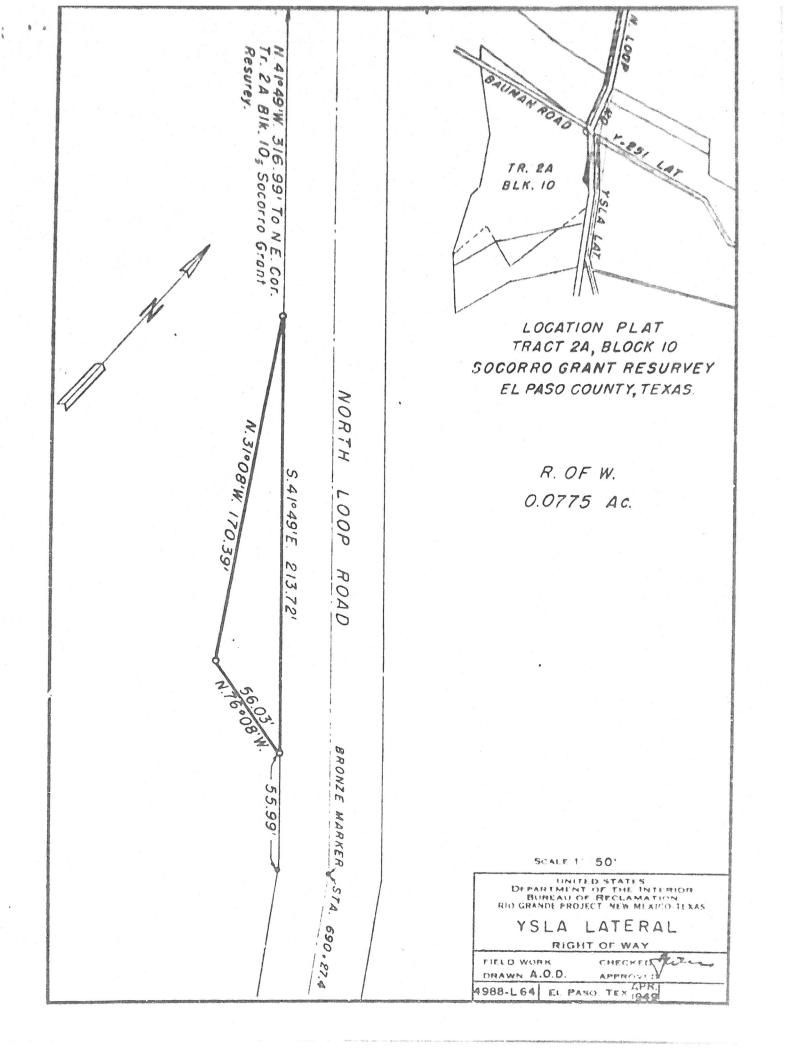

- 1. Receipt is acknowledged of your letter dated June 9, enclosing a right of way deed to be used in the relocation of the Yela Lateral, for review and comment.
- 2. The deed submitted is a valid conveyance of the land described and contains proper covenants of warranty. It is to be noted that the granting clause conveys the land "for irrigation canal purposes" and while the general rule is that a declaration of the purposes for which land is conveyed does not operate to qualify or limit the estate granted, it is possible that in case of litigation, a gratis deed such as this could be construed to be an easement, or restrictive grant, rather than a conveyance of the fee. If your need for the land is limited to use for an irrigation canal, we recommend its acceptance. If an unqualified fee title is required and can be secured for suitable consideration, then the deed should be redrafted deleting the words, "for irrigation canal purposes" from line 7 of the first article.

3. We are returning herewith the deed submitted with your letter.
